| Rhythm or Meter | The beat of a poem |

| Rhyme | The use of words with the same ending sounds |
| Repetition | Repeating words or phrases |
| Alliteration | Repetition of initial consonant sounds <br> repeating vowel sounds in stressed or accented syllables <br> Dictionwriter's word choice - part of writer's style (formal, <br> informal, plain, fancy, ordinary, technical, sophisticated) |
| Mood | the feeling created by the writer in a literary work <br> the writer's attitude (formal, informal, serious, playful, <br> bitter, ironic) |
| Tone | the central message in a literary work |
| Theme | writing or speech not meant to be taken literarily (figures of <br> speech) |
| Figurative Language | words or phrases that appeal to one or more of the 5 senses <br> (they paint a picture) |
| Imagery | the use of symbols. Symbols stand for or represent <br> something else. Ex. dove represents peace, a crown <br> represents authority |
| Word Order | arranging the words in a certain way to create an effect <br> Dictionwriter's word choice - part of writer's style (formal, <br> informal, plain, fancy, ordinary, technical, sophisticated) |
